










Burlington County Energy Aggregation Program



Energy Deregulation

- ➤ New Jersey since 1999
- ➤ Less than 18% of residential customers take advantage of lower rates with third party electric suppliers

What is Government Energy Aggregation

- ➤ Government Energy Aggregation Act of 2003
- Municipality Aggregation
- ➤ N.J.A.C. Title 14:4-6.1 (2012)
 - Council must pass ordinance/resolutions
- ➤ BPU/Rate Council Review
- ➤ DCA Oversight of Auction Process

How the Local Process Works

- Municipality competes against the BPU BGS state default rate
- > Auction held with NJ licensed suppliers
- ➤ Winning supplier is chosen (must be lower than utility rate)
- Auction results compared against utility default rate
- > Rate is locked in for the term
- ➤ 100% price guaranteed always be lower than utility's rate

Auction Results

- Auction was held on 6/14/2016
- Participating municipalities include: Cinnaminson, City of Burlington, Florence, Lumberton, Moorestown, Palmyra, Southampton, Riverside, Woodland, Wrightstown
- > Results:

Atlantic City Electric \$0.08793 vs \$0.10073 (avg. default rate)

JCP&L \$0.08793 vs \$0.1096 (avg. default rate)

PSE&G \$0.11935 vs \$0.12515 (avg. default rate)

What to Expect

- ➤ You will receive a letter explaining the program, the supplier's information, the reduced rate and response options
- Program only includes those who are not currently with a third party electric supplier
- > This form letter developed by the BPU provides:
 - All program information
 - Notifications methods
 - Mail return, 800#, Website

What to Expect

- Utility will send a switch over letter confirming participation
- The letter will come directly from utility and will confirm your exact start date with the supplier.
- ➤ Begin receiving reduced rate with utility's rate compared right on monthly bill


